

Erasmus

There was a great buzz around Francis St. with the Erasmus programme running last week. We welcomed 45 students from Portugal, Poland, England and Turkey. They took part in Gaeilge lessons, yoga classes, Irish dancing and watched our hurling team play a match in Dolphin's Barn. The boys gave the students a huge Franner welcome and have enjoyed an outing with the Erasmus students to Glendalough and a walking tour of Dublin City.



Interview with two Francis St. pupils who have taken part in Erasmus.

What made you want to take part in the Erasmus programme?

Seán: I wanted to know what a new experience felt like.

Alex: To have a holiday with my friends, to interact with new people and I wanted to make new friends.

What has been your favourite part so far?

Seán: To see what the environment of another school is like and to see everyone get on with one another.

Alex: It made me more independent and taught me to work on my own and not ask for help as much.

What would you say to your friends who want to take part in the next Erasmus trips?

Seán: Do your work, if there's a tough challenge keep trying and never give up.

Alex: Always try your best no matter what, take on challenges and be confident. It will be a great trip to Turkey and England.

"Sponsored by Erasmus+, students from Poland, Portugal, Turkey and England had the excellent opportunity of learning outside their countries, while developing the Project "SCIENCE- Soft skills - Tutoring". During this phase of the project, they came to Dublin to train in Mindfulness. While here, they made new friends, met old ones, learnt more about the culture of the country, developed several activities and, of course, practiced Yoga and experienced Francis Street School's holistic approach to learning while they polished their English speaking skills. They also sang and danced to Irish songs and got to know Dublin, which is a very beautiful city. To sum it up, they LOVED the experience because they have learnt a lot. Next October they will visit Turkey to experience another different approach based on Robotics and coding. Next Spring it will be London! They just can't wait to go!"
